AT A GLANCE

Computer Literacy and Internet Knowledge Test (CLIK)

- **The Computer Literacy and Internet Knowledge Test or CLIK**, is an assessment of basic computer skills. It measures a candidate's proficiency with using internet browsers and common desktop applications such as email, chat and word processing programs.
- This test is best used for any position that requires basic computer literacy, including receptionists, customer service representatives, and data entry clerks.
- The test provides one of three possible results: **Highly Proficient**, **Proficient**, and **Not Proficient**.
- The CLIK is a 13-minute test consisting of three 2 to 3-minute task-oriented simulations, followed by 10 multiple-choice questions.

1. The top of the first page of every **CLIK** score report displays the candidate's information, including the candidate's name, position applied for, the date the candidate took the assessment, and the Test Event ID.
2. In the results summary, the CLIK provides each candidate with a proficiency score. These scores range from **Highly Proficient, Proficient, and Not Proficient**.
3. The Test Event ID is given to candidates at the beginning of their assessment and is used if they encounter any issues during the test. They simply return to www.oda1.com, enter their Event ID, and then they can continue their assessment from where they left off.

Proficiency Bar

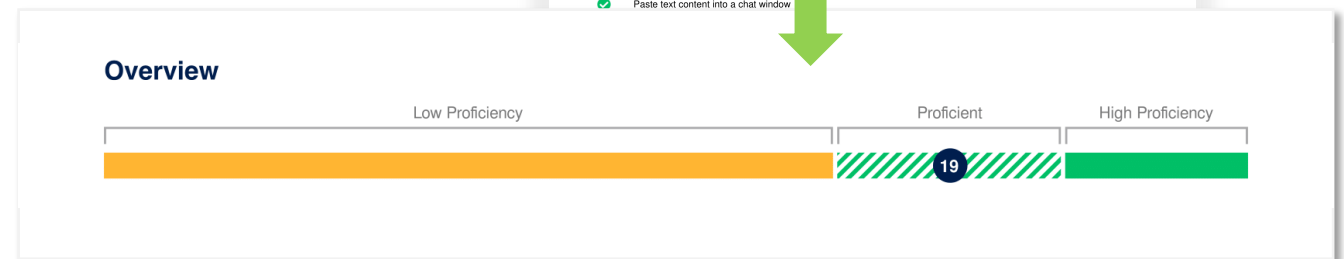
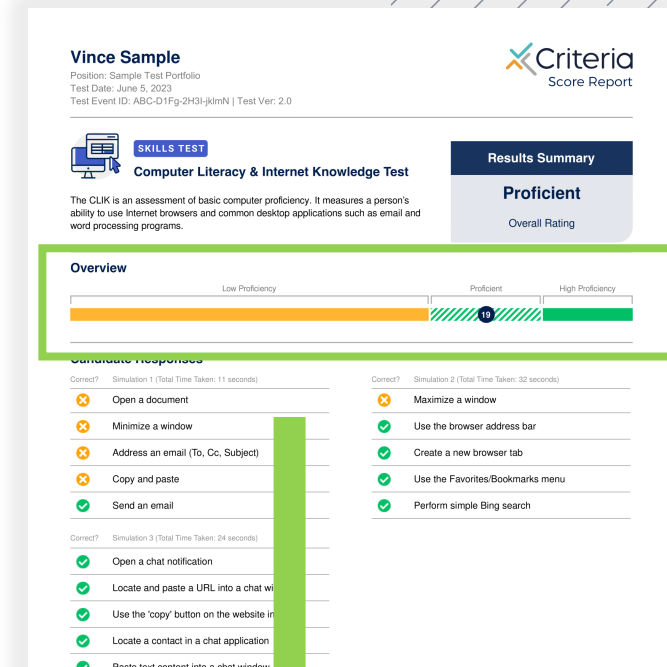
The score report provides an Overview bar that shows exactly how many questions the candidate answered correctly and where that places them on the range of proficiency.

A score of 1-16 will place the candidate in the **Not Proficient** range.

A score of 17-21 will place the candidate in the **Proficient** range.

A score of 22-25 will place the candidate in the **Highly Proficient** range.

The candidate in this example answered 19 questions correctly, placing them in the **Proficient** range.



Candidate Responses

There are two computer simulations on the CLIK followed by a multiple-choice section. The Candidate Responses section lists each question and specifies whether or not the applicant completed the task or answered the question correctly.

All of the simulations take place on a virtual desktop.

1. In **Simulation 1**, the candidate requires the composes a basic email using Outlook.
2. In **Simulation 2**, the candidate performs a web browser search and submits a form.
3. In **Simulation 3**, the candidate uses a chat application to send information to others.

1. In the multiple-choice section, candidates respond to 10 questions that assess basic computer knowledge and includes questions around cybersecurity, calendaring and advanced emailing.

The results explanation shows which multiple-choice questions they answered correctly and how long it took them to complete each question.
