
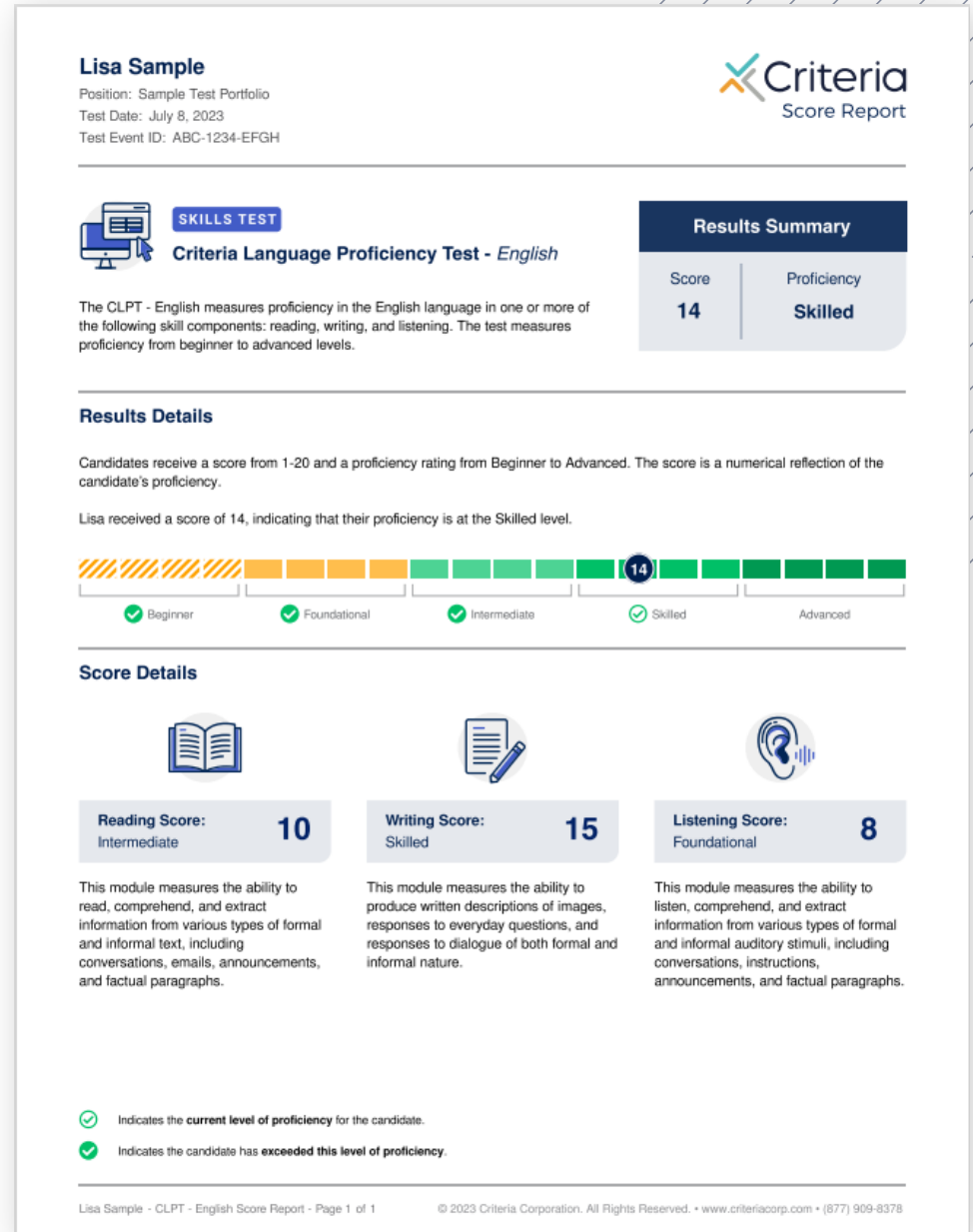


Interpreting the Score Report

 **Criteria Language Proficiency
Test – English (CLPT - English)**

CLPT - English


- The **Criteria Language Proficiency Test – English** is an assessment of English proficiency. It is designed to measure candidates' level of English proficiency across one or more of the following skills: reading, writing, and listening.
- The CLPT – English is a customizable, modular assessment which allows employers to assess the skill areas most relevant to the position being recruited for.
- The Reading and Listening modules contain 13 multiple choice questions each. The Writing module contains 8 open-text questions which are automatically scored by a natural language model. Each module takes approximately 7 minutes to complete.
- Since the test is designed to adapt to the candidate's skill level, the CLPT – English can be used for any position which requires a beginner to advanced level of proficiency with the English language.

The CLPT - English measures proficiency in the English language in one or more of the following skill components: reading, writing, and listening. The test measures proficiency from beginner to advanced levels.

1. The top of the page of every **CLPT – English** score report displays the candidate’s information, including the candidate’s name, position applied for, the date the candidate took the assessment, and the Test Event ID.
2. The Results Summary provides the applicant’s overall numerical score and proficiency rating.
3. The Test Event ID is given to candidates at the beginning of their assessment and is used if they encounter any issues during the test. They simply return to www.oda1.com, enter their Event ID, and then they can continue their assessment from where they left off.

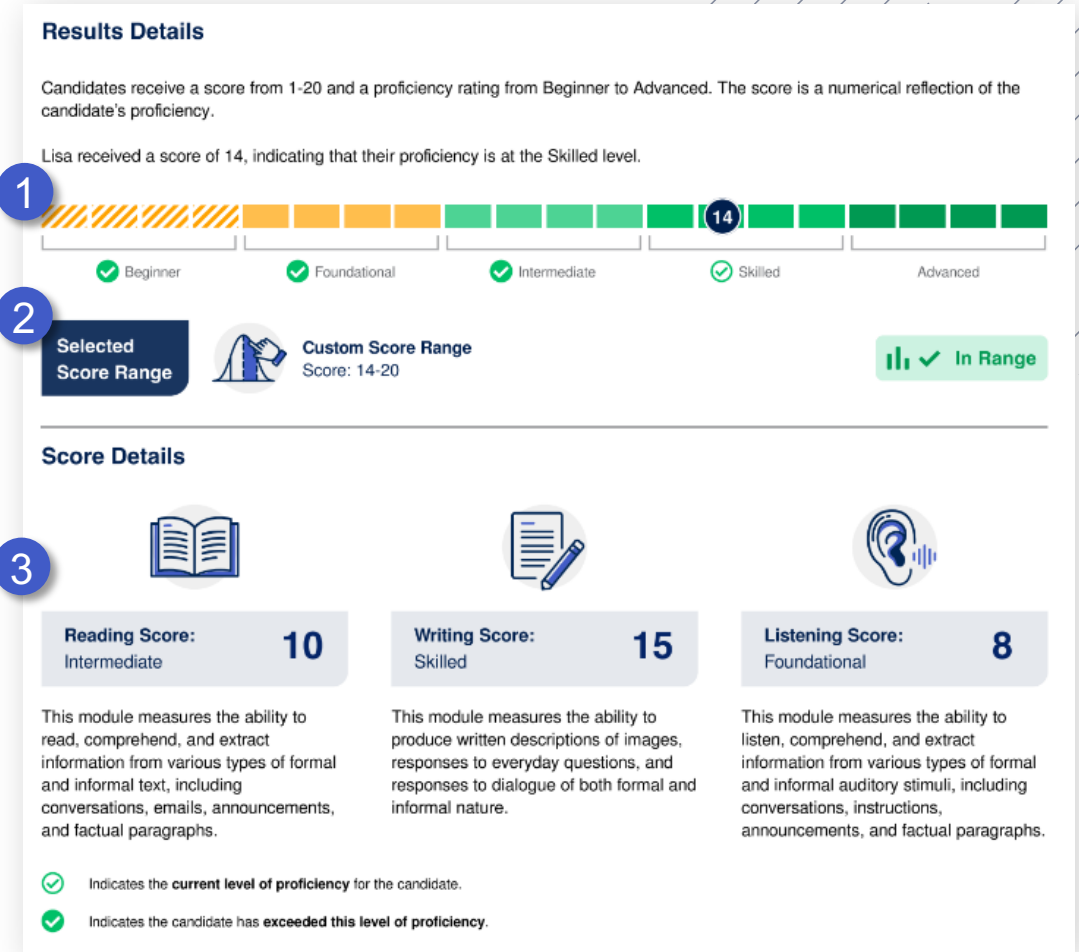
Results Details

- A numerical score and proficiency rating is provided overall, as well as for each individual skill tested (reading, writing, and/or listening).
- The numerical score ranges from 1-20 and is a standard score that indicates how the candidate has performed relative to other people.
- The candidate's score determines their rating of CLPT - English Proficiency. There are five different proficiency ratings ranging from Beginner to Advanced. The score cut-offs that correspond to the different Proficiency ratings are indicated in the table.
- The score that is assigned reflects both the number of questions the test taker answered correctly, and the level of difficulty they were able to work their way up to.

Score	Proficiency
1-4	Beginner
5-8	Foundational
9-12	Intermediate
13-16	Skilled
17-20	Advanced

Results Details

1. The Results Details section also provides a graphical display of where the candidate's score places them on the range of Proficiency.
 - ✔ This icon indicates the candidate has exceeded a Proficiency level and is likely to possess the associated knowledge and skills.
 - ✔ This icon indicates the candidate's current Proficiency level. They are likely to possess some but not all the knowledge and skills associated with that level.
2. If you've created a custom score range, that range will appear in the Results Details section. This will indicate whether the candidate's score fell inside the range you've set.
3. The Score Details section contains a numerical score and proficiency level for each skill assessed. Only the skill modules chosen to be included in the test will appear in this section.



CEFR Equivalence

- The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is an international guideline for describing language proficiency. The CEFR organizes language proficiency into six levels, from A1 to C2.
- Employers who are familiar with the CEFR may find value in using these levels for comparison.
- The **CEFR** section on the second page of the score report provides the CEFR equivalent level for each skill area assessed.

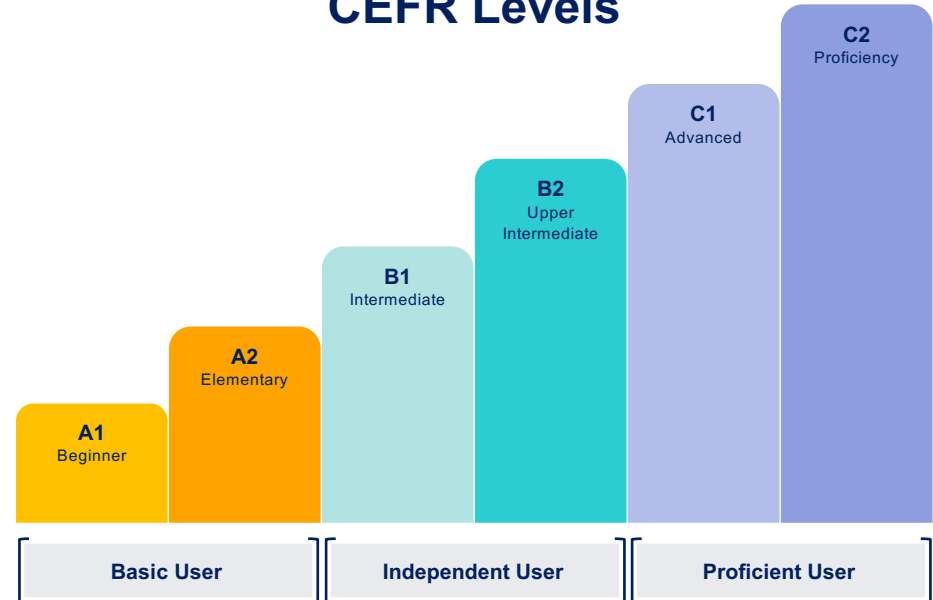
CEFR

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is a widely accepted international guideline used to describe language ability.

The CEFR spans six levels from A1 (Beginner) to C2 (Proficiency). Scores from the CLPT - English are equated to the CEFR levels for those who wish to use it.
