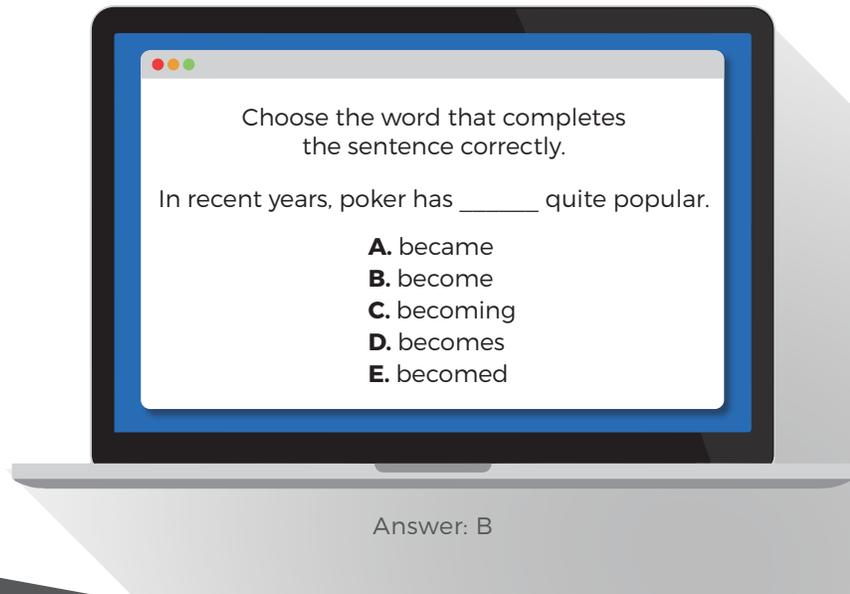

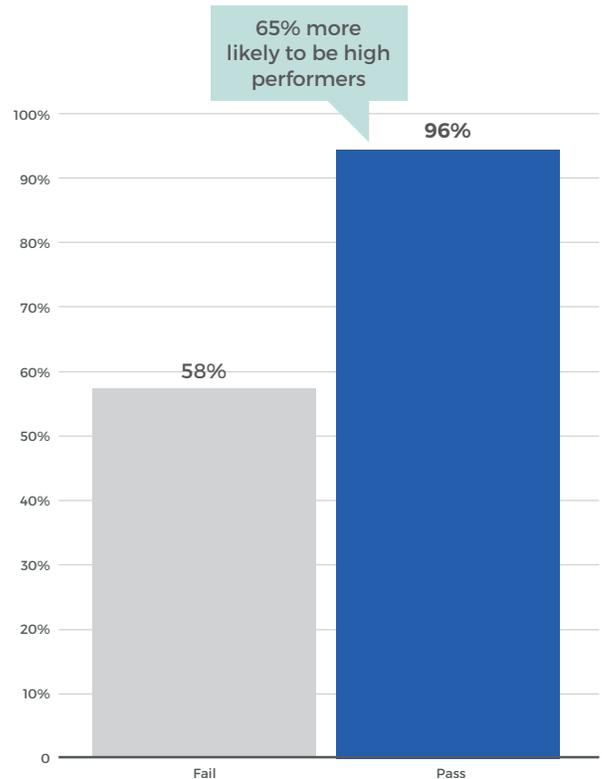
The CBST has been extensively validated to be predictive of performance for a variety of jobs in which basic verbal and math skills are required.
